## **Private Boat Rack Hire and Storage Protocol**

Limited private equipment such as single sculls and oars can be stored by current financial members at the Cure Boating Club boat shed at the Club Captain's discretion. The Club recognises that such equipment is expensive and treats all boats with the utmost care. Below are the criteria that frame this protocol and the method used to determine who qualifies for boat storage in the event there is not room for all. Space is at a premium and priority will always be given to the storage of club equipment.

The committee has delegated accountability for allocation of rack space to the Club Captain.

## **Application**

- 1. All members wishing to store a boat in the Cure shed need to apply by 15 October annually.
- 2. The application includes a short self-scoring ranking form to aid allocation of racks. This becomes important in the event there are more applications than there is room to rack them.
- 3. Rack allocation will be advised shortly after the due date for applications.
- 4. When allocating rack space, common sense and fairness will be applied and decisions that are made will be consistent with the values and objectives of the club.

The self-score information from the application form linked below is a key input into allocation decisions where there is a pinch point, however, the Club Captain retains the discretion to vary from the outcomes of the ranking system where appropriate and consistent.

## Rack Fee

5. The annual rack fee is approved by the Club committee at the time of setting rowing fees and payable once space has been confirmed. Refunds will not be given if the boat is moved out of the shed during the season.
